
CHINMAYA PRADĪPIKĀ CMSD QUARTERLY NEWSLETTER

Śrī Tyāgarāja Ārādhanā



On Saturday **January 18, 2025**, our center celebrated the distinguished saint $Sr\bar{i}$ Tyāgarāja who is known as the father of Carnatic music. The Tyāgarāja Ārādhanā tradition commenced eleven years ago at CMSD, on the same day as the Mahāsamādhi of this great Saint in Thiruvaiyāru. Pañcaratna kṛtis were led by Devesh Vasishtha.

In the morning, Aunty led a heartfelt $p\bar{u}j\bar{a}$ of $Sr\bar{i}$ Ty $\bar{a}gar\bar{a}ja$. Chinmaya Swaranjali offered choice krtis at the feet of the Guru. In the evening, 18 eminent musician visitors offered the renowned pañcaratna krtis - 5 precious jewels compositions of $Sr\bar{i}$ Ty $\bar{a}gar\bar{a}ja$. Amarnath Puttur introduced the musicians' team and Nagesh Nookala explained each krti.

CMSD 24th Anniversary Celebrations



On a beautiful Sunday morning of **February 2, 2025**, CMSD celebrated its 24th anniversary with a special presentation 'Lord *Dattātreya*'s **Twenty-four Preceptors**'. The event commenced with auspicious chants of *Ganapati Atharvaśīrṣopaniṣad* followed by Śrī Jyoti Vināyaka pūjā.

Sukumar Uncle started the formal portion of the program by recollecting memories from the 1990's about Gurudev's vision and how CMSD started on January 28, 2001 with the blessings of Pujya Guruji. San Diego is where Pujya Gurudev left his Jyoti and the *āśrama* is appropriately named *Chinmaya Jyoti* in the city of Poway. Coincidentally, Sandeepany Sadhanalaya, the headquarters of Chinmaya Mission in India, is located in a similarly named location of "Powai" in Mumbai. This was the first of many coincidences and numerous miracles that continue to amaze us to this day and give us the firm conviction of the presence of Pujya Gurudev and His blessings guiding us.



The program commenced with a beautiful invocation by Chinmaya Dhvani and Chinmaya Swaranjali students '*Jayati Jayati Bhārata Māta*' - singing the glory of Bharat Mata (India) which was followed by a *Guru Vandanā* "*Satya pālaka Dharma rakṣaka*" as a humble offering to Pujya Gurudev.


