
CHINMAYA PRADĪPIKĀ CMSD QUARTERLY NEWSLETTER



Śrī Rāma Lallā ratha yātrā comes to Chinmaya Jyoti



 $\hat{S}r\bar{i}$ $R\bar{a}ma$ Lall \bar{a} was ceremoniously brought inside the $\bar{a}\dot{s}rama$ in a procession, under an umbrella, carried by Jayantibhai and $P\bar{u}rnakumbha$ held by Sukumar uncle. The air was filled with the chanting of *puruṣasūktam* and bells. Lakshmi auntie carried the *akṣata kalaśa* from *Ayodhya*.

Lakshmi auntie welcomed Vishwa Hindu Parishad America (VHPA) to CMSD. She mentioned that the auspicious *Rāma Lallā* has come in a week that marks the 108th *Chinmaya Jayanti* in two days. With grand fervor and faith, proper *ārādhanā pūjā* and *naivedyam* were offered to *Rāma Lallā*.

Our center was the 441^{st} temple visited by the divine *Rāma Lallā*. The *kalaśa* containing the *akṣata* and lord's blessings were brought from *Ayodhyā* after the *prāṇa pratiṣṭhā* on January 22^{nd} of this year by Tejal Shah, Jt. 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As an offering to the revered spiritual teacher *Bhagavatpāda Ācāryaḥ Śankara*, BV children with *sevaks* and *sevikās* staged the 7th CMSD production '*Sambhavāmi Yuge Yuge*' on May 12, 2024, under the guidance of Lakshmi Aunty.

The thought for this production evolved through the past decade before it materialized post the 23rd anniversary program - tribute to Mother *Gangā*, the one inspiring Pujya Gurudev to bring the wealth of Vedas to the masses. This production was truly a perfect homage on *Ādi Śankara Jayanti* and Pujya Gurudev's 108th *Jayanti* celebrations -- glorifying the *Avatāras* of Lord *Viṣṇu* and reaching a pinnacle of *nitya śudhha avatāra*.

The emphatic and faith-instilling verses 7 and 8 of Chapter 4 of the *Śrīmadbhagavadgītā* form the central message of the play.

We learn about the *paurāņik* and *vedāntik* significance of the Divine appearances of Lord *Viṣṇu*'s 10 *Avatāras* across various *Yugas* through a conversation between BV children and *Bhagavān* accompanied by his consort Śrī Laksmī Devī.

The whole conversation starts with a realistic and relatable question from a BV child grappling about why *Bhagavān* is not here amidst us in spite of all the "bad" she sees in the world. And lo! Lord hears her heartfelt plea and gives her His *Darśan* in her dream.

What follows is a conversation between the Lord and the BV children, which is enduring and glimmering with unblemished innocence of the children questioning the Lord about His various forms. While the Lord answers as always with compassion coming "down" to their level and simplifying His intent - sometimes with humor, sometimes with but mostly with love.

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The play began with a beautiful *Bharatanātyam* invocation by **Srimeenakshi Srinivasan** depicting the *Daśāvatāras* to the song *Pārkadal alaimele*.

And as the story went on, with each *Avatāra* entering the stage, the whole audience including 5-year-olds were rapt with attention. The masterful storytelling is in conveying subtle *vedāntik* teachings with simplicity and the performance has achieved it.



With the finale song '*matsya kūrmā varāho narahari*...' the *Daśāvatāras* staged around the octagon and mesmerized the audience while the BV children beautifully performed the action song.

As shared by our CMSD *sevak*, **Rajasekar Vaidyanathan**, "Once again a quintessential CMSD production giving us not only the story but the deeper significance behind each *avatāra*. Soulful chanting, melodious music, graceful dance, and peerless performances by our BV children, all strung together seamlessly in a beautiful garland-offering to *Bhagavān Śaṅkara*."

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As the child is almost at the verge of waking up, *Bhagavān* leaves her with the message - "Do your best and leave the rest!" conveying to her that Pujya Gurudev is His form guiding her with his teachings to navigate the world.

Creatively contrasting the infinite compassion of the Lord displayed through the *Daśāvatāra* epic and the Divine appearances and Real Intelligence to the modern-day Artificial Intelligence, the Robotics presentation cleverly made a profound statement, 'Finite plus Finite cannot become Infinite. God is All Powerful with Infinite capabilities'.

CMSD 24th Annual Program Presentations

The CMSD Annual program presentations this year, as in the recent past years, were spread over three weekends - Languages, Shishu Vihar - Bala Vihar classes.

Language classes Presentations - June 2, 2024

On June 2, 2024 members of *Chinmaya Jyoti* gathered to celebrate its 24th Annual Program from the following language programs: Tamil, Hindi and Sanskrit.

CMSD Tamil *Pallikkūdam* students from levels 1 through 4 started off with *tamilttāi vālttu*, the song praising mother Tamil. Then, all of them presented prayers on lord *Gaņeśa*, *Kartikēya* and *Viṣņu*. Level 1 students showcased children's rhymes.

Level 3 & 4 students conversed in Tamil about *Tiruvalluvar* and his magnum opus, *Tirukkural*. Then, each one of them presented a *ku<u>r</u>al* (couplet), its meaning and our Pujya Gurudev's quotes that convey similar thoughts. Couplets chosen were on devotion, proper learning and abidance and righteousness.

Language learning goes beyond grammar, vocabulary, and pronunciation. To truly understand a language, one must delve into its literature. In Hindi spiritual literature, Saint Kabir Das *Sākhis* and *Dohās* stand out for blending spirituality with everyday experiences, creating idiomatic expressions that defy linguistic norms.

During this year's annual Hindi Program, CMSD Hindi Teachers, across all the grade levels, introduced the works of Saint Kabir Das. His words contain timeless wisdom, woven seamlessly into daily life and accessible to all in their own language. Discussions leading up to the actual presentation enabled the students to relate these teachings in their own lives.

All samskṛta vihāra students (batches 1-9) started their presentation with "mangalācaraṇam" followed by "māheśvarasūtrāṇi". Based on the theme of values connected to Pujya Gurudev's quotes, **Batch 8** play "kṛtajñā pipīlikā" demonstrated the value "attitude of gratitude" by an ant who was saved by a dove from drowning. **Batch 7** play "alasaḥ bālakaḥ" depicted a lazy boy who realized that laziness is the greatest enemy residing in the body, and decided to give it up.

Batches 5-6 presented a story of a bird with two mouths and one stomach. After finding a fruit, one mouth did not share the fruit with the second mouth. The second mouth, driven by anger, ate a poisonous fruit. As a result the bird died - demonstrating the importance of *Yajña bhāva*.

Batches 2-4 presented the play "gobhaktah Dilīpah" which highlighted gosevā as govindasevā. Various subhāsitāni (eloquent quotes) along with meanings were connected to Pujya Gurudev's quotes and presented by **Batch 1** students.

CMSD 24th Annual Program Presentations

Shishu Vihar and Bala Vihar upto Grade 8 Presentations - June 9, 2024

CMSD conducted the Shishu Vihar to Bala Vihar Grade 8 Annual Program on June 9, 2024. Pujya Gurudev's signature movement to revive Hinduism, namely, his spiritual discourses or *jñāna yajñas* which he conducted while crisscrossing the globe, were highlighted in Grade 6 students' presentation. In fact, on this, His 108th *Jayanti* year, the theme for the entire program for all classes was "The Spirit of Yajña".

After an invocation by Chinmaya Swaranjali, Shishu Vihar children and their mothers sang a song "everything I do is a gift to you" as part of their presentation. The Chinmaya Dhvani group then sang of the beauty and harmony nourished in Bala Vihar with the song - "Chinmaya Bala Vihar *lāyegā navinatā..*".

Harmony and beauty come from working cooperatively for a higher purpose. That message came through in an entertaining fashion during presentations by **PreK**, making a beautiful picture takes many unique and colorful crayons, **Grade 1**, body parts find that they need to help each other to live and grow together, and **Grade 5**, the *devas* dine at Lord *Nārāyaṇa's* banquet without bending their elbows by feeding each other rather than vainly trying to eat on their own like the *asuras*.

The worshipful and grateful attitude signified in *yajña* spirit was depicted in the story of *Kārtikeya* (Grade K) while the grace and blessings showered by the Lord on his devotees working in the *yajña* spirit was enacted by several BV classes. Grade 2 depicted the story of Lord *Kṛṣṇa* holding aloft the *Govardhana* mountain and the devotees' song (The Lord of all sweetness is nothing but sweet). Grade 3 enacted a scene from Bala Ramayana where Lord *Rāma* and *Lakṣmaṇa* protect the *yajña* of sage *Viśvāmitra*. Grade 4 depicted the blessings of Lord *Rāma* on the hardworking squirrels building the bridge to Lanka, while Grade 7 showcased His compassion to His devotees *Jațāyu* and *Vibhīṣaṇa*.

The program concluded with **Grade 8** enacting the story behind the golden mongoose from the *Mahābhārata*. The selflessness of a brahmin family in being ready to sacrifice mortal life itself for the sake of a guest, who is like God himself, was shown in their presentation. Even *Yudhisthira's* royal *yajña* could not compare against this ultimate *yajña bhāva* of a poor family.

Bala Vihar Grade 9 through Grade 12 Presentations - June 16, 2024

Continuing with the *yajña* spirit, the high schoolers presented their learnings using everyday activities and relatable happenings on **June 16, 2024**. The event commenced with **CMSD's Chinmaya Swaranjali** offering an invocation to the Lord. **Grade 9** children presented how even the daily act of eating food can be a *yajña*. **Grade 10** students exhibited how nature exemplifies *yajña bhāva* and how the human race needs to make eco-friendly and sustainable choices and protect Mother Earth. **Grade 11** brought forth life lessons from chapter 13 of the *Bhagavadgītā*. Students from **Grade 12** chose elections as a medium to showcase how our spiritual values can be adopted across all lines of work to be successful, and thereby making a positive impact in the world.

Children across all grades for Bala Vihar and Language classes with perfect attendance were recognized and presented with e-certificates.
